Rend Lake 2025 Fisheries Fact Sheet

Location – Rend Lake is located in Franklin and Jefferson counties along IL Interstate 57 approximately 15 miles south of Mt. Vernon just northwest of Benton.

Area – At normal pool (405.0 feet), Rend Lake has a surface area of 20,633 acres, a maximum depth of 35 feet, and a mean depth of 10 feet. The lake is thirteen miles long, three miles wide, and has 162 miles of shoreline. It is the second largest impoundment in Illinois.

Status of the Sport Fishery – The fish population is surveyed annually, and summaries of some of the more popular sport fisheries below are based on the results of the most recent fall population surveys.

Largemouth Bass – Bass fishing at Rend Lake should be good in 2025. During the 2024 survey, bass were collected at a rate of 141 fish/hr. The average catch rate during the last 10 surveys is 77 fish/hr. Of the 703 bass collected during the 2024 fall survey, 24% exceeded the 14-inch minimum length limit, 19% were greater than 15 inches, and 6% were over 18 inches. The largest bass collected in the 2024 survey was 6.3 pounds. No spotted bass were collected in the 2024 survey.

Crappie – The fishing prospects for crappie remain excellent for 2025. The 2024 catch rate for crappie (48 fish/net) was above the 2023 catch rate of 33 fish/net but below the five-year average catch rate of 54 fish/net.

Twenty-one percent of the white crappie collected during the netting survey were over 10 inches and another 21% were between 9-10 inches. Only 3% of the crappie collected during the netting survey were over 12 inches and no crappie over 15 inches were collected in the electrofishing or netting surveys.

Six percent of the black crappie collected during the netting survey were over 10 inches and 11% were between 9-10 inches. No black the crappie over 12 inches were collected during the netting survey although 1 was collected in the electrofishing survey.

Overall, sixteen percent of the crappie collected during the netting survey were over 10 inches and 19% were between 9-10 inches. Only 2% of the crappie collected during the netting survey were over 12 inches and no crappie over 15 inches were collected in the electrofishing or netting surveys. The small percentage of crappie over 12 inches and lack of crappie over 15 inches suggests that crappie harvest is high. Eighty-one percent of the crappie collected during the netting survey were white crappie.

Bluegill - Bluegill will be abundant in the coming year with most keepers measuring 7-8" in length and averaging 1/3 pound or less. A few bluegill over 8 inches were collected during the survey.

Redear Sunfish – While not abundant, a few redear sunfish are collected in annual surveys. Redear up to 8-9 inches and weighing 0.5 pound were collected in the 2024 survey.

Catfish - The 2024 catch rate for channel catfish was 8 fish/hr which was below the five-year average catch rate of 14 fish/hr. In the coming year channel catfish from 1–3 pounds should be abundant with larger fish up to 5 pounds common. Seven flathead catfish were collected during the survey and ranged from 5-18 inches in length with the largest weighing 2.6 pounds.

Striped Bass Hybrids - Six striped bass hybrids (13-14 inches) were collected in the 2024 survey. The number of hybrid striped bass remains low. No striped bass hybrids were stocked in 2024. Many anglers target the striped bass hybrids in the tailwater below the dam in the spring (April/May).

White Bass – The 2024 catch rate for white bass was 12 fish/hr which was equal to the ten-year average catch rate of 12 fish/hr. Anglers can expect the catchable population in the coming year to be largely comprised of fish 12-15 inches and weighing 0.8-1.5 pounds.
